The CAAPS 41th Annual Convention will be held on Sunday, August 14, 2016, at the Sheraton LaGuardia East Hotel in Flushing, New York, NY, USA. Founded in 1975, CAAPS is one of the most prestigious and influential Chinese American organizations in the United States. Most of our members are distinguished scholars and professionals who are actively involved and committed to the well-being of Chinese communities. Include in this space a very short summary of the abstract. Use Times New Roman font, 11 pt. Justified left and right. For title, authors name and affiliations, margins are 2.5 cm left and 2.5 cm right and for summary 3.5 cm left and right.

1. General (Times 12, regular)

Contributed papers must be in English or Chinese. The total length, including figures and references and a short bio (include a 2×4 photo) of the presenter, is two Letter-size format page. The authors are responsible for the content and style of the contribution and should submit it in a word document file so that any necessary editing may be carried out by the Conference organizers. Contributed papers which do not conform to the format described below may be rejected. Each abstract should be submitted separately in electronic form to the respective session organizer:

All contributed papers will be refereed by the session organizer and chairperson. A book of proceedings, containing accepted abstracts will be distributed to the participants on their arrival to the conference site.

2. Recommendations for the text

2.1. Format

For invited and contributed papers, the abstract should be typewritten for Letter-size paper, using one column Times New Roman font (exactly according to the present template). Margins are:

Top, Bottom: 2.5 cm; Left and Right: 2 cm.

Fonts must be:

Title: Times 14, Bold, centered.

Authors names: Times 12, normal, centered. Affiliations: Times 11, Italic, centered.

Main text: Times 12, regular, justified in left and right. Figure and table captions: Times 11, regular, centered

Headings (Times 12, bold) are placed flush on the left-hand margin on a separate line.

2.3. Figures, tables and equations

Abstracts may include figures and tables. A caption should be attached to each of them. The captions are shown here:

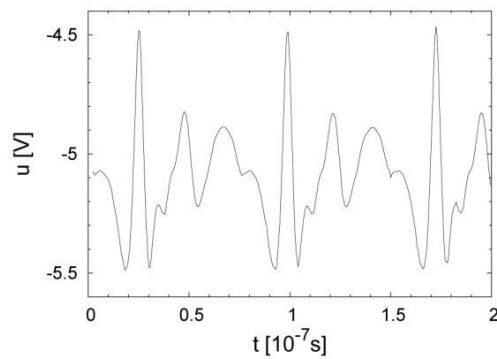


Fig. 1: A caption to this figure.
